iii. Income	Given the subject of the letter, and the use of ἀσθενῶς <i>asthenos</i> (l. 4) one assumes that a) Epiodoros was financially unable to continue as a member, and b) that the obligations may have been significant enough to cause Epiodoros to leave.

XII. NOTES

i. Comments	There is nothing in this document to suggest that Epiodoros was the patron of this club; in fact the context suggests that Epiodoros pointedly includes himself among the <i>synoditai</i> . Concerning the issue of impoverishment at the heart of Epiodoros' resignation, see Lewis 1937: 65, n. 2; cf. P.Graux 2 = SB IV 7462 = Sel.Pap. II 281 11-13 (AD 55-59) which may well suggest influence or power, however.
