<b>i.b. Document(s) typology &amp; language/script</b>	Funerary or honorary inscription in Greek of the <i>thiasetai hoi syn Parmenisko</i> for Agathostratos son of Minion <i>Trallianos</i> .
<b>i.c. Physical format(s)</b>	Marble slab. H. 22 x W. 32 x Th. 9 cm.
<b>ii. Source(s) provenance</b>	Found in Palatia, built into the floor of the church of Panagia Palatiani. Seen by Foucart (1875: 322 no. 12). Note that by the time Paton and Hicks published the volume on the Koan inscriptions, the inscription had been moved to Syme. Peek (1969: 13) also saw the inscription in Syme.
