ii. Name elements	Heroic: <i>Heroistai</i> : from an unknown hero, perhaps a heroized descendant.
iii. Descriptive terms	κοινόν, <i>koinon</i> (?) ἔρανος, <i>eranos</i> (?)
Note	<i>koinon</i> : IG II ² 1339, ll. 5-6 <i>eranos</i> : IG II ² 1339, ll. 14, 17 Although the term κοινόν, <i>koinon</i> is wholly restored I think it is convincing since the context requires a similar term. On the other hand the term ἔρανος, <i>eranos</i> , (also part restored) is uncertain as one could easily supply <i>koinon</i> instead (ll. 14 and 17).

i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	Decision of the association on the payment of a modest fee by the members of the group to finance the sacrifices, with the necessary exemptions. If not, they shall be expelled. In the end there was a clause about joining the association. Written in Greek.
i.c. Physical format(s)	Marble stele measuring 0.27x0.22m.
ii. Source(s) provenance	Found in the southern slope of the Athenian Acropolis, now in the Epigraphical Museum, EM 7774.

VII. ORGANIZATION

ii. Leadership	Perhaps the chief- <i>eranistes</i> (ἀρχεραμιστής, <i>archeranistes</i> , l. 4) was the leading personality of the group.
iv. Officials	Treasurer (ταμειούοντος, <i>tamieuontos</i> , l. 2).
vi. Laws and rules	The association introduces rules about the payment of a fee (6 dr.) by those present and the absent members (reduced to half, 3 dr.); exemptions are made in case of illness and mourning, ll. 6-15: προνοηθῆναι τῆς [προσόδου ὅπως οἱ ἀποδημοῦντες τῶν Ἡ[ροίστων καθ' ὄν]δηποτεοῦν τρόπον διδώ[σι εἰς τὴν θυσίαν?] δραχμὰς τρεῖς, οἱ δὲ ἐπιδη[μοῦν]τες καὶ μὴ παραγινόμενοι ἐπάναγκ[ες ἀποδιδώ]σι τὴν φορὰν τὰς ἕξ δραχμ[ὰς εἰ]ὰν καὶ μὴ? λάβ[ω]σιν τὰ μέρη· ἐὰν δὲ μὴ διδώ[σι τὴν φορὰν, ἔ]δοξεν μὴ μετέχειν αὐτο[ῦς τοῦ ἐράν]ου ἐὰν μὴ τι συνβῆ διὰ πέ[ν]θος ἢ διὰ ἀ[σθ]θενείαν ἀπολειφθῆναι, <i>pronoethenai tes [prosodou hopo]s oi apodemountes ton He[roiston kath' hon]depoeteoun tropou dido[si eis ten thysian] drachmas treis, hoi de epide[mountes kai] me paraginomenoi epanank[es apodido]si ten phoran tas hex drachm[as ean kai me lab]osin ta mere; ean de me did[osi ten phoran, e]doxen me metechain auto[us tou eran]ou ean me tini synbei dia pe[n]thos e dia a[stheneian apoleiphthenai.</i>

Judicial system	Failure to pay the fee results in expulsion from the group, ll. 12-15: ἐὰν δὲ μὴ διδώ[σι τὴν φορὰν, ἔ]δοξεν μὴ μετέχειν αὐτο[ῦς τοῦ ἐράν]ου ἐὰν μὴ τι συνβῆ διὰ πέ[ν]θος ἢ διὰ ἀ[σθ]θενείαν ἀπολειφθῆναι, <i>ean de me did[osi ten phoran, e]doxen me metechain auto[us tou eran]ou ean me tini synbei dia pe[n]thos e dia a[stheneian apoleiphthenai.</i>
viii. Obligations	Members were obliged to pay the fee as delineated above, ll. 6-15.
